

In 2016 RuPaul won an Emmy for Outstanding Host For A Reality Program

In 2014 RuPaul won the Realscreen Award for Best Host/Presenter

RuPaul's Drag Race also won the 2014 Outstanding Achievement in a Competition/Talent & Studio-Based Program Award at the Realscreen Awards

RuPaul's Drag Race was nominated for a 2014 Critics' Choice Television Award for Best Reality Show Host and won the award for 2014 TCA Award for Outstanding Achievement in Reality Programming!

In 2012, RuPaul won Best Host at the Factual Entertainment Awards and RuPaul's Drag Race won Best Studio-based Competition Series

In 2012 and 2013, TV.com named RuPaul as Best Reality Show Judge/Host and RuPaul's Drag Race as Best Reality Competition Series

In a 2013 national poll at RyanSeacrest.com, *RuPaul's Drag Race* was voted as the **#1 Reality Competition Show**, beating out *The Voice* and *Dancing with the Stars*

13 entries on the Dance Club Songs chart, including two No. 1 singles: "Back to My Roots" and "A Shade Shadey (Now Prance)"


Three Billboard Hot 100 hits, including a 20-week run for debut single, "Supermodel (You Better Work)"

Four hits on the Dance/Electronic Songs chart, including his most recent entry: "Sissy That Walk"


